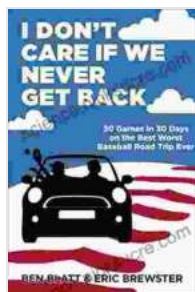


30 Games in 30 Days: An Unforgettable Adventure on the Best Worst Baseball Road Trip Ever

A Road Trip Like No Other

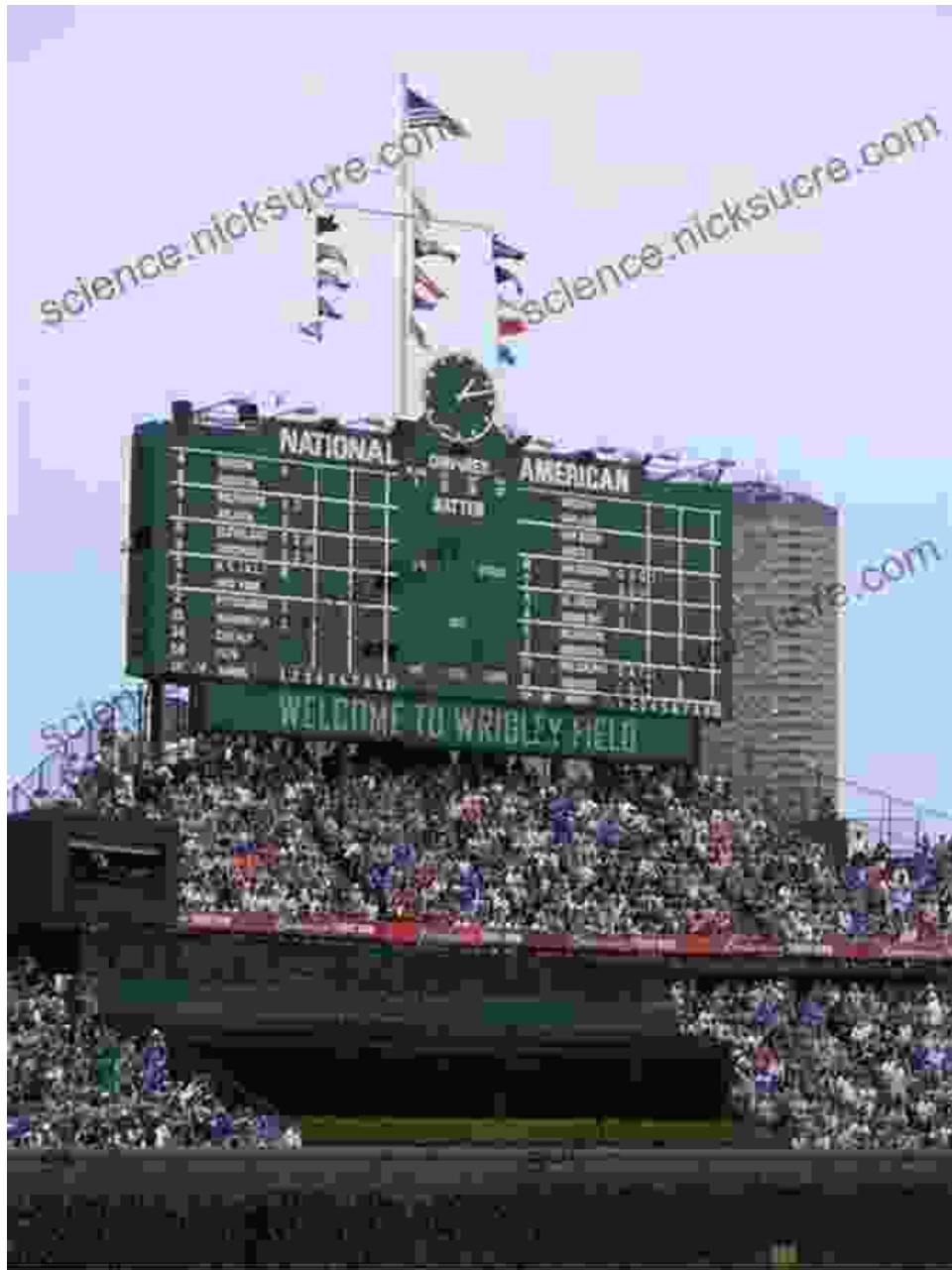

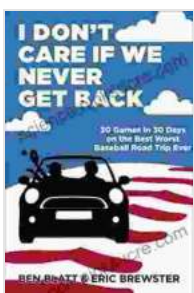
The End of an Era

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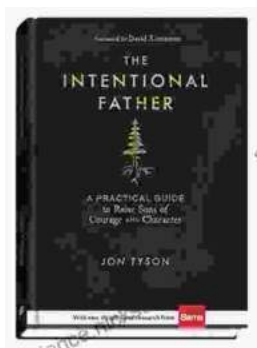
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
