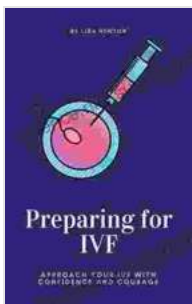

The IVF process

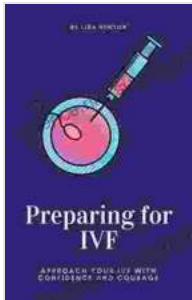
