- Respect the environment and leave no trace of your visit.

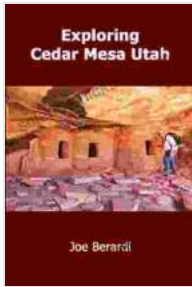
You can camp in designated areas within Cedar Mesa, but permits are required. Reservations can be made in advance through the Bureau of Land Management website.

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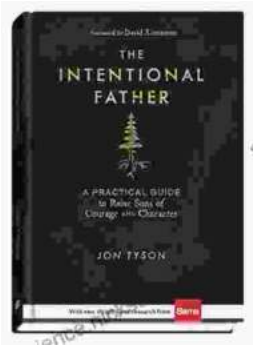
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
